About the Calendar

Performing Arts Experience Grants for Alternative Education

The Oklahoma Arts Council is thrilled to introduce for the 2022-23 school year, [Performing Arts Experience Grants for Alternative Education](#). Made available through the Oklahoma State Department of Education's federal coronavirus relief funds to address disruptions in learning experiences by students due to the pandemic, the goal of the new grant program is to expand access to live performing arts to more Oklahoma students. Through the program, alternative education school sites can present performing artists for an in-school concert and provide student field trips to live performances. The program can support opportunities in dance, drama, literary arts, media arts, and music.

To assist and inspire schools interested in benefiting from this new grant program, the Oklahoma Arts Council is pleased to offer the Performing Arts Experience Calendar. The calendar highlights a sample of artistic events in various disciplines scheduled to take place in locations throughout the state—from Ardmore to Bartlesville, Broken Arrow to Chickasha, Enid, Oklahoma City, Tulsa, and more. Please note this calendar is not a comprehensive list of all performing arts opportunities available to your school, and events not listed on the calendar may be eligible for funding through this grant. For questions about performing arts events not listed in the calendar, and event eligibility, please contact Oklahoma Arts Council arts education staff, listed below.

At the bottom of each of the following event pages is a helpful link to the event website for details and ticketing information. Performing Arts Experience Grants for Alternative Education can be used to cover the cost of ticket prices and travel expenses. Please note tickets for most events will need to be purchased and reserved in advance. Inquiries about age-appropriate content should be directed to the organizations presenting the program.

Schools interested in presenting performing artists for an in-school concert or performance are welcome to contact the Oklahoma Arts Council for assistance. The agency maintains a vetted list of artists on its Oklahoma Performing Artist Roster who are interested and available to travel.
